Keith Tomlins is a Professor of Food Science at the Natural Resources Institute, University of Greenwich, United Kingdom. He is responsible for managing and undertaking research, consultancy and teaching work internationally. He has been involved in research in the area of root and tuber crops since the 1990's and has co-edited a book on Sweet Potato, and has a number of international peer reviewed publications in this area involving processing and value addition, consumer acceptance, nutrition, storage and transport.
